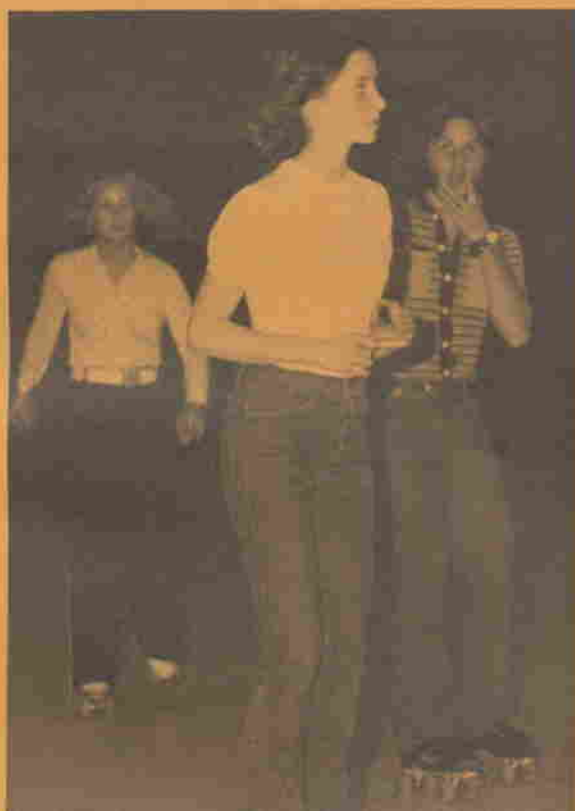






1st Annual Jr.-Sr. Roller Skating Party

Dedication

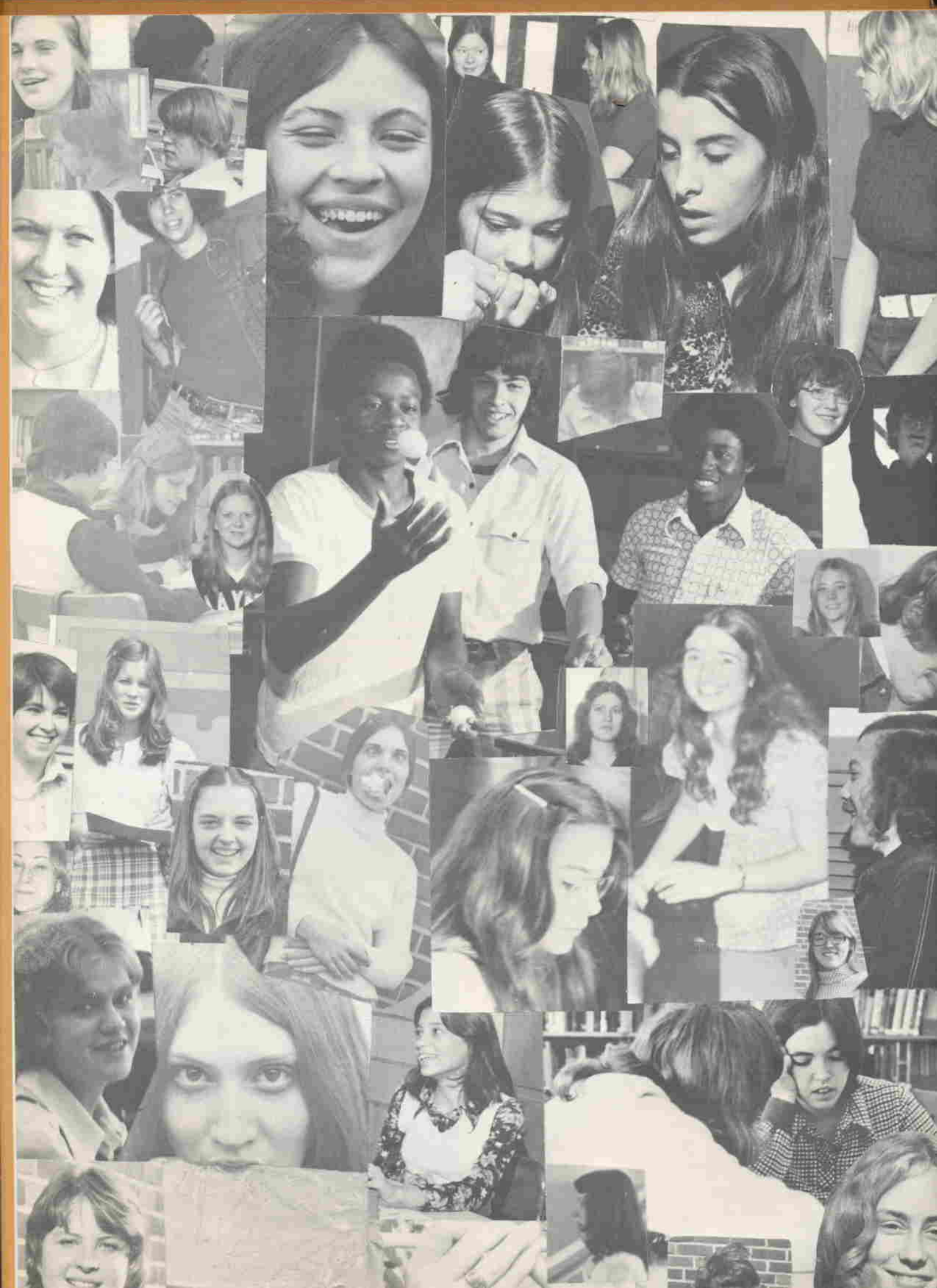

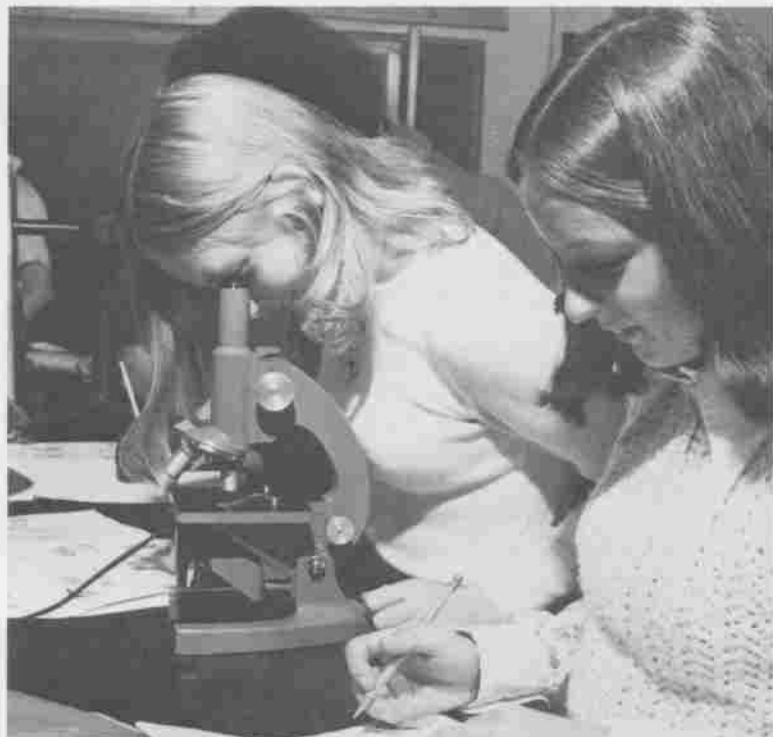
