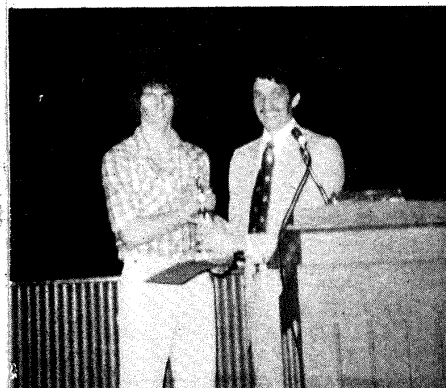

Jim Frauel started on the mound for Wayne but had control problems, giving up nine walks in five innings. Marty Aman had two of Wayne's six hits.

Tennis Team Opens Season

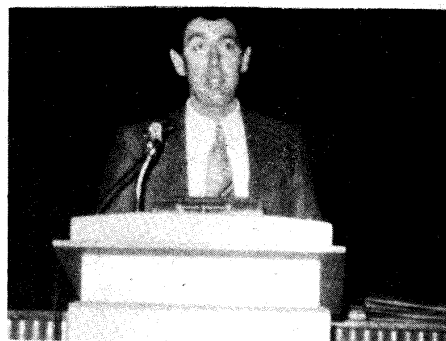

Pal-Mac will probably give the Wayne boys the toughest test, but Coach Terry feels his boys can go all the way if they play up to their potential.



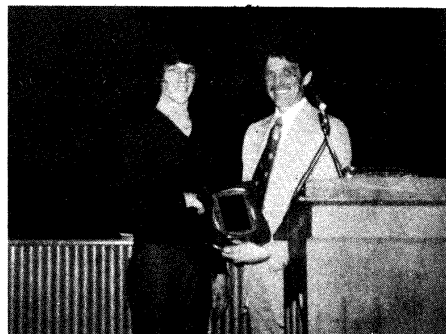

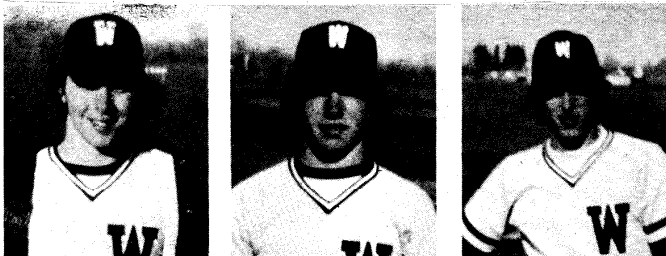

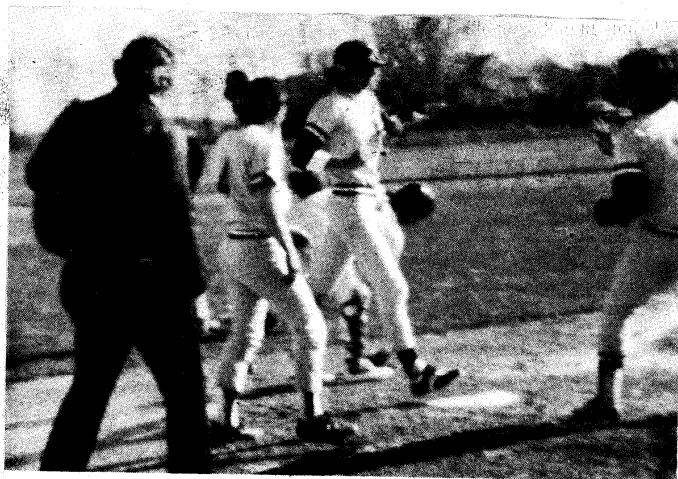
