
Dear Wayne Eagle Staff,

Each underclassman uses the old and used paths of yesterday in making the decisions for today. Tomorrow is the long awaited day when the goal of the senior year is reached.





From the minute the curtain opened until the close, laughter roared throughout the entire theater. Yes, this play may very well one day be presented once again on Broadway with the original senior play cast.







MUSIC WRITE-UP


As in the past, music expresses a universal language. From classic to jazz to popular, the styles of music change but always transmit a message.

Mr. Weisendreder's Tennis team had their opponents bouncing all over the courts. The tennis players are expecting to bring many more victories to the school.


