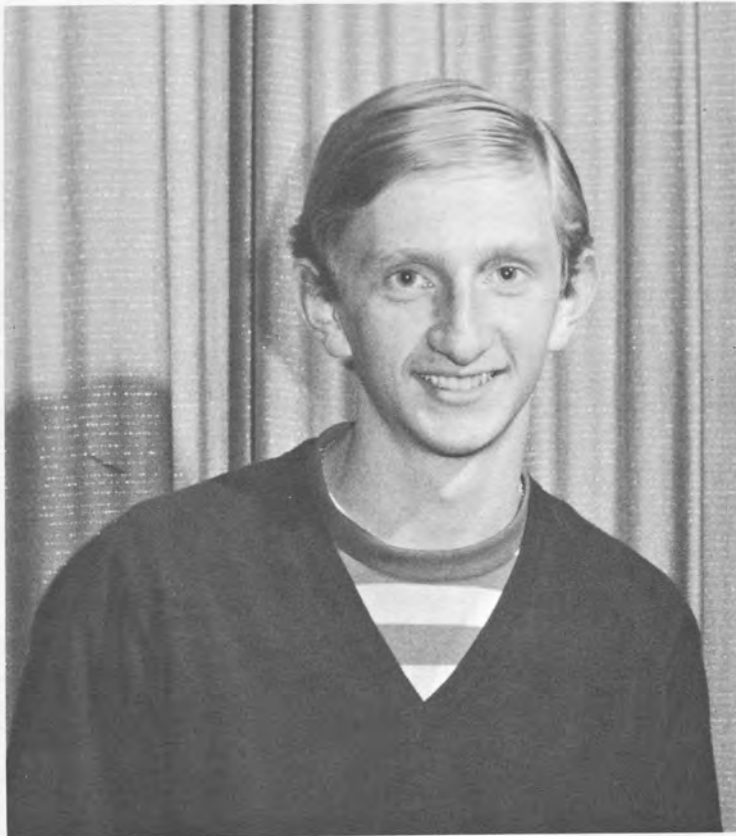
Of course many thanks go to Mom, Dad, and Diane Riker, whom, with everything they did for me, helped to make my stay pleasant too.

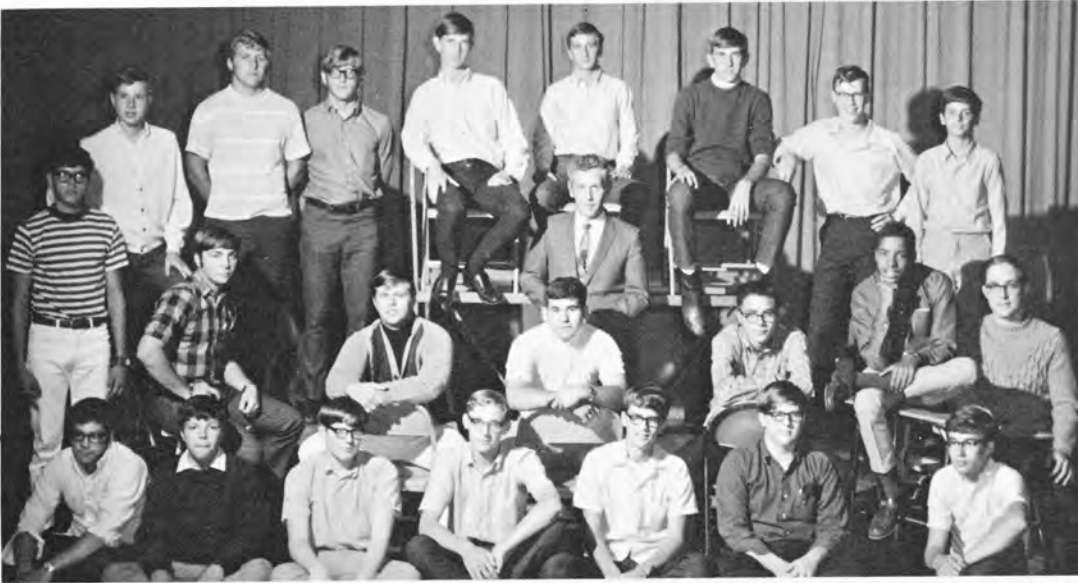
Like everything else that changes through time, Student Council is no exception. It is no longer just a government, it has taken on various projects as well.

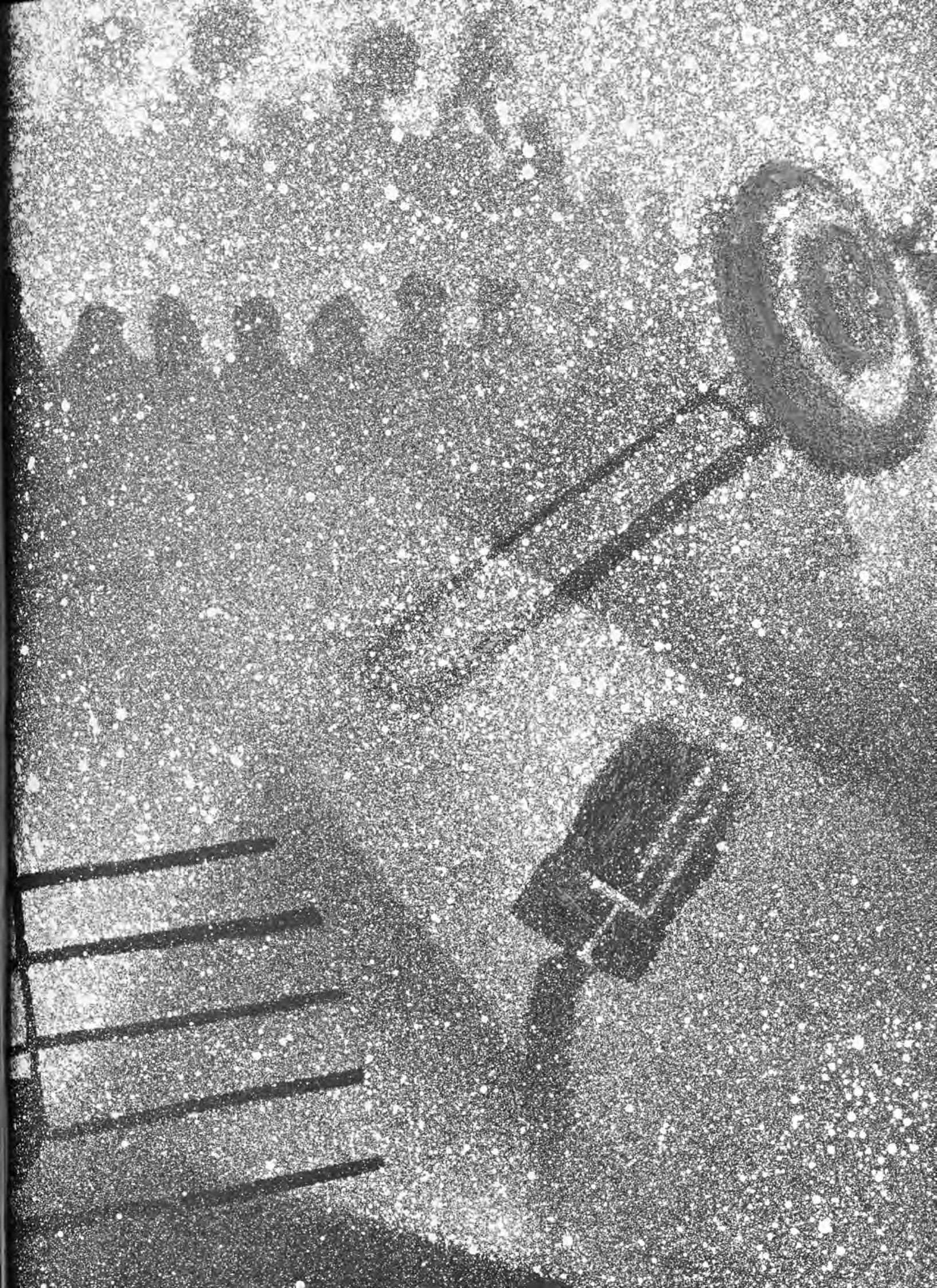

MUSIC WRITE-UP

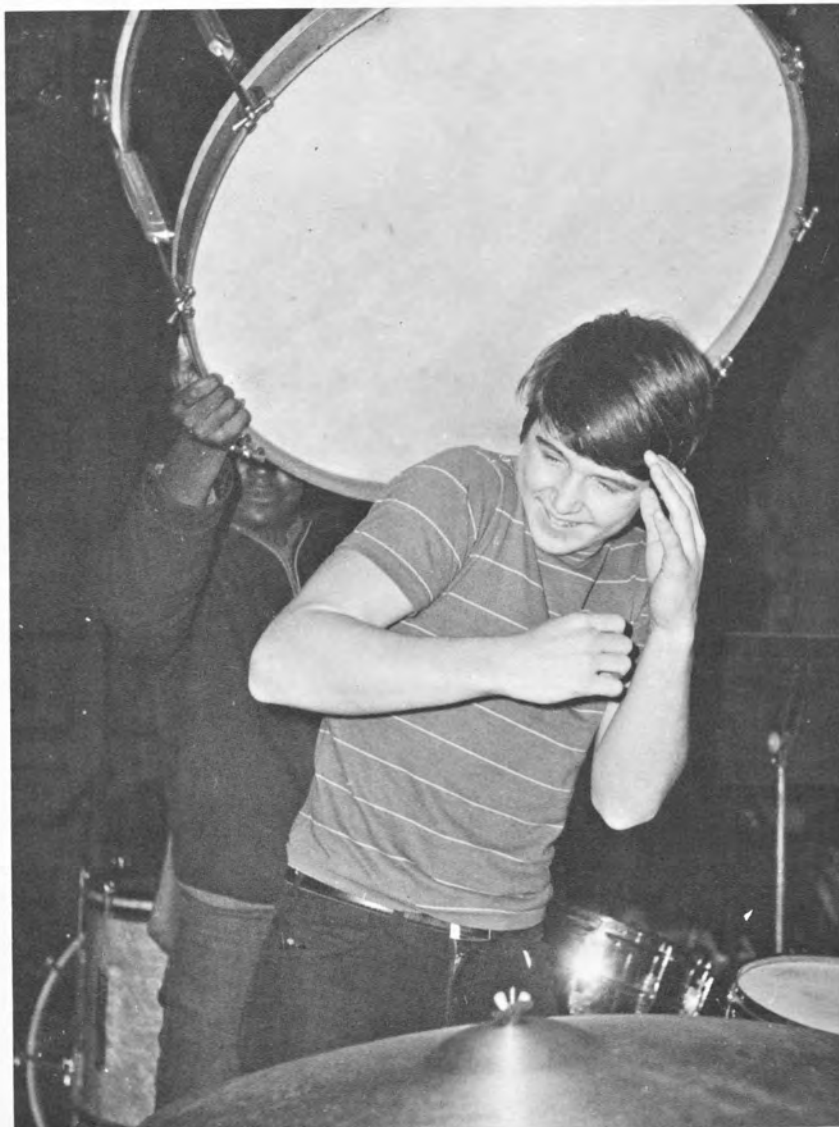
As in the past, music expresses a universal language. From classic to jazz to popular, the styles of music change but always transmit a message.

Mr. Weisendreder's Tennis team had their opponents bouncing all over the courts. The tennis players are expecting to bring many more victories to the school.

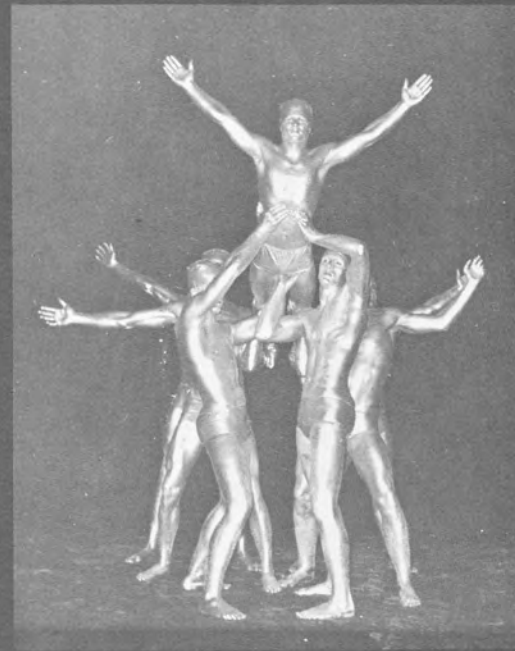
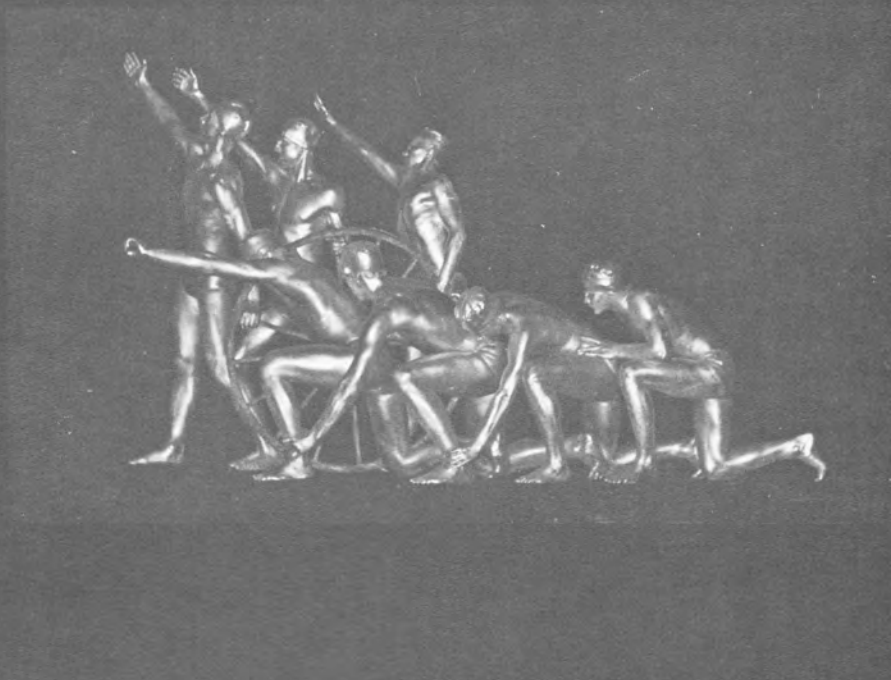
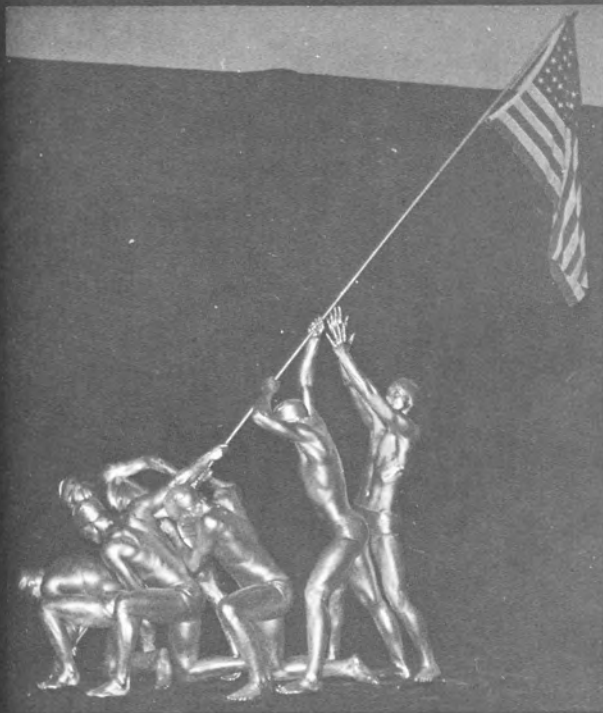
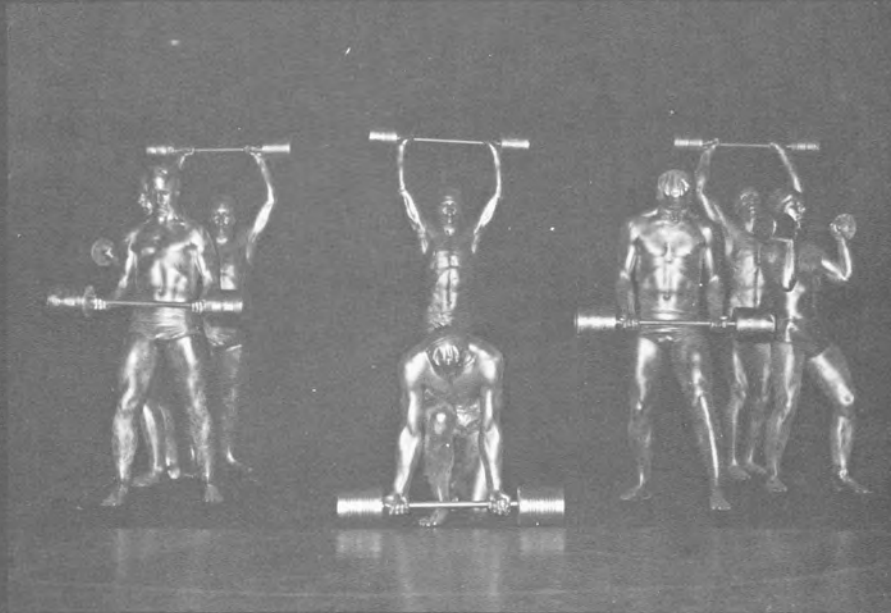
